A word from the President...


Welcome to the 2015 Cairns and District Junior Rugby League competition.

Yarrie Juniors enjoyed a training clinic attended by several members of the Northern Pride as well as former Rabbitoh Rhys Wesser over the Easter school holiday break.

NRL Game Development Officer for Cairns Alby Anderson said it was a great day. "Always great coming down and watching the kids play here," he said. Northern Pride player Semi Tadulala said it was a good opportunity to go over some basic skills with the kids.

"They're enjoying themselves," he said. "It's good to come here and promote the game, it just shows we're trying to grow the game of rugby league into our communities and it's important we do this kind of thing." Mr Wesser agreed these days were very important.



"Being in Yarrabah today is about engaging our Indigenous communities as a place for them to aspire to achieve their dreams and their aspirations, and just to develop good relationships with the Rabbitohs and with different communities all around Queensland and New South Wales," he said. "It's really, really important to get out to these communities and see where they're at and help develop relationships and help push them into who they want to become down the track. Some are quite new; whilst some have played last year.


To us and to them, winning is not considered a serious factor. It is about engaging kids to be happy and playing footy that really counts.

It brings a lot of laughter and satisfaction when we see our grandchildren having the time of their life on the footy field.


We would like to thank the club officials in allowing the Under 6's the opportunity to play, which is highly satisfying to be involved at the grassroots level to help build up the club for future years.
