A hazardous grass fire behind Cressbrook Street was quickly contained earlier this week by our local firefighters.


Woorabinda Rural Fire Service Second Officer Fred Zbierski said although the fire was contained quickly, it was still hazardous to community.

"And although we do not know for certain the origin of the fire, we would like to call on parents to educate their young people about fire and the risks and hazards It can pose to community when not used in a controlled way" Mayor Josh Weazel said residents should always aim to stay fire safe.

"During the coming bush fire season it really important we practice fire safety and try to educate others around fire safety," he said.

Woorabinda Aboriginal Shire Councilor and Kulgoodah Dancer Joel Cameron (pictured right) said the postponement was for the best.


"We thought it was best to postpone the event until the situation around COVID in our region is clearer," he said.

Vet encourages vaccinations and treatment for all our dogs

During a visit to Woorabinda late last month Moura Vetinary clinic Vetinarian Andrew Morely (*pictured* on the right with Vet Nurse Kate) spent some time with the WASC News to talk about his day

"Mainly vacciniations and health checks, and fleas, tick and worm treatments, they are the main things we do," he said.

"But if anything comes in with an injury, we can also have a look.

"We've had about 10 dogs come in so far this morning and a few people have come in too.

"If you want to look after your dog properly it's definitely important to keep your animals vaccinated and keep the fleas and tics under control.

"It makes a much healthier dog, so not only is it much better for the dog, it's much better for the people who own them."
