Apunipima works to resolve cyber issues

Apunipima recently became aware of a cyber security incident where a third party gained unauthorised access to the Apunipima computer environment and possibly downloaded some information.

"We are taking all appropriate actions in response," they said.

"As soon as we became aware of the incident, we engaged leading external cyber security and forensic experts to support us in managing the incident, securing our systems, restoring system functionality, and commencing a forensic investigation into what had occurred."

They said they were unsure as to when their system would be back up and running and would, in the meantime, revert to manual processes.

"Our number one priority is the continuity of care and health services to the people and communities we serve," they said.

"We are aware that the delivery of some services to patients and clients is taking longer than normal.

"We are working closely with Queensland Health and other local Cape York based service providers to ensure the continued timely provision of high-quality health and community services to the people and communities we serve."

They said they were also working with authorities, including the Australian Cyber Security Centre (ACSC) and relevant law enforcement authorities.
