Last week candlelight vigils were hosted around Queensland in memory of all Queensland Police Officers who lost their lives in the line of duty.

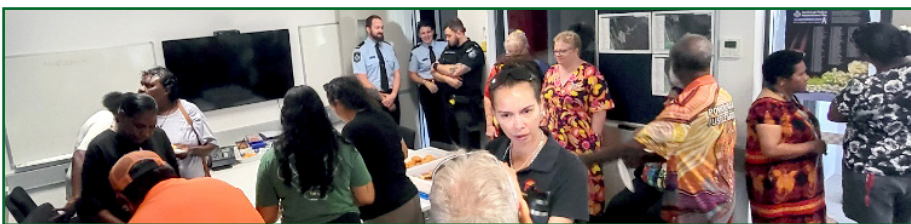
Deputy Police Commissioner Cameron Harsley said they stood with the families who had suffered the loss of loved ones in service to the state.

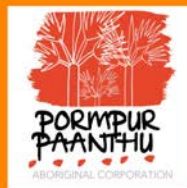
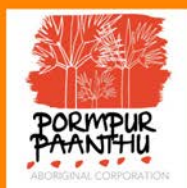
