Knowledge of country to be shown on boardwalk

Local knowledge of country will soon be on display as part of a botanical signage project for the Boardwalk at the Yarrabah Arts Precinct, Manager Darrell Harris says.

"We have a James Cook University student, Yoni Rankin, undertaking a placement and working in partnership with us to assist," he said.

"The partnership is the beginning of building of a long term relationship to between the Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire Council's Arts and Cultural Precinct and the James Cook University to encourage volunteer PhD students to help with various projects in and around the Precinct."

Ms Rankin said the partnership included the

Gunggandji Aboriginal Corporation RNTBC.

"The aim of the project is to collect and document knowledge of the Yarrabah country focussing primarily on interpretative botanical signage for the Rainforest Boardwalk at the back of the Menmuny Museum," she said.

"Traditional Owner Knowledge is integral to the success of the project, and the Gunggandji Aboriginal Corporation RNTBC has endorsed the use of their Traditional Knowledge for the development of the botanical signage."

The Gunggandji Corporation also asked Ms Rankin to help them collect ethnobotanical and cultural information for input into the Gunggandji Cultural and Ecological Information Management System, which is a computer database also known as CEIMS.

"The information in the CEIMS database is a keepsake for knowledge of culture, community and country for current and future generations," Ms Rankin said.

The Knowledge of Country
Project is due for completion at
the end of this month.
