Get your kids vaccinated at school TOMORROW, Wednesday and Thursday this week, and pick up \$25 per child from 5-16-years-old.

Consent forms are available now - less than 15% of our kids have been vaccinated, putting those of our elderly and vulneralble who haven't been boostered at risk.

COVID is still in our community and a second wave is still possible, health authorities say.

Why vaccinate children if they don't get very sick?

Although COVID-19 in children is milder than in adults, there is strong evidence that vaccination against COVID-19 can provide an extra protection for children against serious illness from COVID-19.

It can also reduce the spread of the virus to protect family, friends and other vulnerable people in community.

Boosters essential

Vaccination rates have come up a lot on Palm, but some of our older and vulnerable people are still at risk.

Queensland's Chief Health Officer has confirmed those who haven't had their booster are more likely to end up in hospital or worse.

There have been COVID deaths in Cape York and in other Aboriginal communities, and there are several in ICU.

If you haven't had your booster, get it now — they will come to your house — call 0459 924 304 to book a visit, or go to the Primary Health Centre, now open seven days a week.

Our school kids are out in the community but only two out of three of our Elders have had a booster shot — Public Health advise vulnerable people should stay home until they have their booster.

Another ten days at home after their final vaccination is also recommended.
