## Stay alert 4 COVID

After more than 60 days of COVID on Palm Island our Local Disaster Management Group has finally reverted to twice weekly meetings, instead of being 24/7 watch, with no loss of life and much improved vaccination rates.

Mayor Mislam Sam said the move was now to a watching brief as the COVID outbreak entered a new stage.

"The story of this outbreak is Palm Island has gone from very poor vaccination rates to very high rates, now at nearly the same rate as the rest of Queensland," he said.

"This did not happen by accident, it took massive commitment by many and residents stepping up as requested. Finishing off the boosters is our current focus. We can't drop the ball."

He stressed there was still work to do.

"We still have active COVID in our community - on Saturday we had a reported 29 positive cases and we know the total number of infected

people is probably closer to 100," he said.

"The reality is, living with some level of COVID in our community is our new normal. We need to continue to ensure our vaccinations are completed.

"Protection for children from 5-years and over is critical. Please continue to wear our masks anytime, we can't socially distance. Don't rely on government rules, just be sensible and protect yourself."

He said he was grateful to everyone who had stepped up.

"The Palm Community responded marvellously by observing our stay home requests, increased vaccination campaigns and widespread testing, allowing us time to

slow down the spread and help the vulnerable members of our community to finish their vaccinations," he said.

"My personal thanks to everyone for their selfless service and dedication whether staff or residents.

"Many people have had to work two roles during this time and they stepped up without complaint.

"64 days ago I asked for people's support to come together and face this threat shoulder to shoulder - united.

"Palm Islanders rallied and did exactly what they were asked to do and the results speak for themselves - thank you."

The LDMG will continue to meet twice weekly and provide daily updates.
