"Hard work and persistence has paid off.

"Many thanks to our team and partners including the Department of Environment and Science, MAMs group, headed by Louise and her husband Rob who have supported the team with on and off site training and operational support, and the COEX (Container Exchange) team Krystoff, Phil and Albertus.

"Also Hoff, Tajah and Ian, our open space champion, for a long, hot but rewarding day on opening, and **G**reg, Tania and admin central, thank you for your support with printing and supplies."

Container Exchange (COEX) is the not-for-profit organisation created to establish and run the Containers for Change scheme in Queensland, and the Palm Island depot is a PIASC initiative.

She said the opening, held last Wednesday, was well supported with more than 3,000 containers deposited in the first three hours. "The first truck load of containers arrived for counting, followed by bag drops from other community members, which was consistent throughout the day," she said.

"The team were on the ground to roll cans down the counting tables, which was a great success.

"This is a milestone for PIASC and our community."




Nominations are now open for SENIOR MENS, WOMENS and MIXED LEAGUE TAG Teams.
