

New funds boost to Palm's 'circular' economy

The Queensland Government will provide \$3 million to the Palm Island Aboriginal Shire Council to build a circular economy centre and waste and recycling facility, including a green shed, a men's shelter, and a men's diversionary program.

Palm Island Mayor Cr Mislam Sam said the new waste and recycling facility would support the Council's aspriations towards caring for Country.

"This new modern waste and recycling facility will support Council's integrated focus on caring for land and sea country and growing our circular economy," he said.

"With support from DES, Council has completed a major metal recycling project on Island, which saw over 500 tonnes of scrap metal taken off Island," Mayor Mislam Sam said.

"We have placed twenty new metal public bins around the Island with waste management, sustainability and caring for country messages on them that were designed by the local school kids, that are seeing an additional 2000 litres of waste removed from public spaces each week."

CEO Michael Bissell said the investmet was welcome.

"The investment will create several local jobs during construction and support ongoing employment opportunities once operational," he said.

"This modern waste and recycling facility will be a wonderful addition to our critical infrastructure on Palm Island and will be built adjacent to our new 'Palm Island Circular Economy Centre', that incorporates our Container Deposit Site, Men's Shed and Green Shed.

"This will enable community members to significantly increase their reuse and recycling efforts and ensure we maintain our pristine environment on Palm Island.

He said Council's two waste management objectives for the community were:

- a) all waste goes off the Island and there are zero discharge to land and waters; and,
- b) a commitment leading practice and innovative waste management solutions that drive reuse and recycling, and keep waste management costs and risks low.

Environment Minister Meaghan Scanlon said Palm Island had environment and cultural value which was why the community was keen to reduce waste, recycle and look after **C**ountry.

"Right now, all waste on Palm Island is put into the same bins and shipped back to the mainland, which isn't a cheap exercise," she said.

"This will give the community and council the ability to sort waste on the island, ideally recycle and repurpose and reduce the amount of rubbish heading to landfill. There's also a really good opportunity not just in the waste space but in creating jobs during construction."

Ministerial Champion for Palm Island and local MP Scott Stewart he and the Council had advocated for these projects for a long time.

"It's important to have more services like this on Palm Island as not only do they help create good jobs but also help ensure people are supported in the community," he said.





On 22 February 2023, Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk MP introduced the Path to Treaty Bill 2023 to Parliament.

As part of the process of passing this Bill, a Public Forum will be held on Palm Island and in Townsville on Wednesday 22 March, to allow stakeholders and community members to submit their views.
