Palm Island's existing tip site is being cleaned up in readiness for a new waste and recycling facility Council is about to build, which it hopes will be ready to open by mid-2024 (pictured above & left).

Drop into the Council office for more information if you're keen, but in the meanwhile a huge number of batteries have been removed from the dump and taken to the barge depot ready to be shipped off the island (pictured below).

Civil and Open Space manager Vaughan Charles worked with supervisor Lenin Yassarie and labourer Billo Wotton to send them to the mainland via barge, and then to the Ingham tip where they will be recycled.
