Travelling to Townsville for medical care?

If you have a procedure or surgery booked at Townsville University Hospital you will get a one-way ticket from Palm Island to Townsville for you and one escort.

What happens next

- A letter confirming your appointment will be sent to the Palm Island post office or you will get an SMS sent to the phone number you provided Joyce Palmer Health Service.

 Contact the health service if you need to update your phone number.
- Before your travel to Townsville is booked you need to come to the Joyce Palmer Health Service to complete paperwork. You should do this at least three days before your appointment. Bring your letter or phone message with you.
- Don't foget to collect your travel documents from Joyce Palmer Health Centre to take these with you when you travel to Townsville.

You cannot collect your travel documents on the weekend. The Joyce Palmer Health Service is open Monday to Friday 9am - 4pm.

Think about the following

Do you need to travel by plane or ferry?

Will you need accommodation in Townsville?

Accommodation depends on availability
Patient travel only covers the cost for the
patient and one escort

Do you require a taxi voucher to travel to the hospital?

Taxi vouchers are only accepted by one taxi company -Townsville Black and White Taxi

Do you need the Queensland Health bus to pick you up and drop you off on Palm Island?

If you are travelling with an escort:

Patients can only travel with one escort.

If you travel with any additional people,
you will have to pay for their travel and
accommodation in advance.

An escort must be over 18 years old. You must provide the name of your escort before you travel.

If your child needs to travel for their health care, they can only travel with one escort.

After your procedure or surgery

Your doctor in Townsville will decide when you are ready to be discharged from hospital and can go home. An Indigenous Hospital Liaison Officer (IHLO) in Townsville will organise for you to travel home to Palm Island on the earliest available transport, which suits your medical needs. They will also organise suitable transport to the airport or ferry terminal on the Queensland Health Day of Discharge Unit bus and ensure you're able to travel.

If you chose to stay in Townsville for any period after the earliest available transport, which suits your medical needs Patient Travel will not cover the cost of your travel or accommodation.


