NOTICE OF INFORMATION MEETING FOR THE EASTERN KUKU YALANJI, WESTERN YALANJI, YIITHUWARRA AND GUUGU YIMIDHIRR NATIVE TITLE GROUPS

This notice is to advise that Cape York Land Council (CYLC) will be facilitating two meetings on **Tuesday 10 September 2024** on Palm Island.

Meeting 1 is for any of those Eastern Kuku Yalanji, Western Yalanji, Yiithuwarra or Guugu Yimidhirr people who reside on Palm Island who wish to be provided with an update in relation to the progress of the Cape York United #1 Claim (CYU#1 Claim) and the proposed native title determinations over the areas shown in pink on the map below.

Meeting 2 is for any of those Eastern Kuku Yalanji people who reside on Palm Island who wish to be provided with an update in relation to the group description, by descent from apical ancestor, of the Eastern Kuku Yalanji Native Title Group. The first meeting was held in Cairns and this meeting is to be held on Palm Island for those residents of the community who were not able to travel to the meeting in Cairns. CYLC will not be providing travel assistance for this meeting.

Purpose of Meeting

Meeting 1: The legal representative of the Applicant will provide an update of the progress of the CYU#1 Claim to Eastern Kuku Yalanji, Western Yalanji, Yiithuwarra and Guugu Yimidhirr Native Title group members who reside on Palm Island.

Meeting 2: This meeting is for Eastern Kuku Yalanji Native Title Group members only. This meeting is a further meeting following the group description meeting in Cairns on 16 and 17 July 2024. This meeting is taking place on Palm Island to provide opportunity for discussion about group description to Eastern Kuku Yalanji People who were not able to travel from Palm Island or surrounding areas to the meeting on 16 and 17 July 2024.

The purpose of this meeting is for the legal representative of the Applicant in the CYU#1 Claim to provide information to the Eastern Kuku Yalanji Native Title Group about the following matters:

- 1. The progress towards determination of the area associated with the Eastern Kuku Yalanji Native Title Group towards a consent determination in May 2025; and
- 2. The draft native title group description, by descent from listed apical ancestors, for the Eastern Kuku Yalanji Native Title Group.

The legal representative of the Applicant will be seeking feedback on the draft native title group description. The Independent Genealogist (Family Tree expert) will be present at the meeting and will have availability to meet with family members as requested.


There will be a further meeting in October 2024 where the Eastern Kuku Yalanji Native Title Group will be asked to make a decision about the apical ancestors for the Eastern Kuku Yalanji Native Title Group.

Residents are warned to keep well away from Francis Creek, where a 2–3 metre crocodile sighting has been confirmed.

Rangers will work with the QPWS to trap and

remove the animal in the coming days. Council has issued strong warnings to the community – especially children – to stay out of the water in the area.

xy S22 Ult

Never swim in water where crocodiles may live even if there is no warning sign present. When fishing, stand at least a few metres back from the water's edge and never stand on logs or branches

overhanging the water. Never clean fish or discard fish scraps near the water's edge, around camp sites or at boat ramps. Never provoke, harass or interfere with crocodiles, even small ones, and do not feed crocodiles – it is illegal and extremely dangerous to do so.
