 - a. the grant of mining leases ML100329 and ML100330;
 - b. Variation of mining leases ML10170 and ML100144; and
 - c. Including additional areas into mining lease ML 1682.

(2) Seek standing instructions from Birriah People regarding the negotiation and execution of future native title agreements under section 31 of the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth), for projects within the Birriah native title determination area.

COMMUNITY NOTICE DISASTER PREPAREDNESS HARD WASTE CLEAN UP

We are having repeated issues with our onboard sullage system due to the flushing of baby wipes in our on board toilets.

They are causing our macerators to block which shuts down our onboard toilets.

We installed a back up macerator however now we are finding that both of these pumps are blocking on board.

This issue will lead to service disruption if we can't stop the wipes!

In the last two weeks we have nearly had to cancel two services, with emergency parts arriving minutes before departure.

Please make sure you put your wipes in the bin, not the loo!
