Another successful grant application means PPAC will be able to further help NDIS recipients in Pormpuraaw get the most out of their services.




"The funds will help with registering and delivering services under the NDIS which means improving access, choice and control for NDIS participants and potential participants.

What are the side effects?


Not everyone will have side effects.

For those that do have side effects, they are minor and could include possible symptoms such as:

- redness and/or swelling where you received the needle
- mild fever
- feeling tired
- headache

You will be monitored for 15 minutes after receiving the vaccine to see if you show side effects or reactions, which happens with all vaccinations.
