### **Palm Island** wins Bishop **Malcolm** carnival!!!

A Palm Island united side and family team Bwgcolman Brothers travelled to Yarrabah late last month to play in the Bishop Malcolm Allblacks carnival. Bwgcolman Brothers lost the Plate Final to Yarrabah's East Coast, while Palm Island defeated Cairns-based Descendants for an overall Cup win in a nail-biting final.

## Mayors back call for extended anti-graffitti laws

Statewide backing for a call to extend anti-grafitti laws was one of several outcomes for Mayors, Councillors and CEOs from all of Queensland's 17 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Shire Councils participating in the Local Government Association of Queensland's (LGAQ's) annual conference in Cairns late last month.

Delegates from all over the state voted in favour of the motion tabled by the Indigenous Leaders Forum, a collective of Queensland Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander council representatives.

LGAQ President Margaret de Wit said overall it had been a landmark conference for the organisation.

"This is the first time we have had the same percentage of Indigenous delegates as there are Indigenous Councils," she said.

"It is so great to see the confidence, the amount of interest, the work that is going on in the Indigenous communities."

Mayor and LGAQ Executive Committee member Cr Alf Lacey said financial sustainability had been a big part of discussion.

"Financial sutainability is something Indigenous Councils have to look at very seriously," Mayor Alf Lacey said.
He said issues such as land tenure were also high on the

tenure were also high on the agenda. The jury's out on that one and it's going to require quite a bit of discussion, particularly with the Minister, in terms of rateable lands and things like that," he said.
"I think I can honestly say there are going to be some major changes in my life time.
"I didn't think I'd ever see

the changes we have seen, particularly in home ownership. "I was first elected to Palm Island Council in 1994, home ownership was talked about then and even in the 1980s, when Bob Katter was the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs in Queensland.

"That's why the Deeds of Grant in Trust were born, to allow Indigenous communities to do things with their own land, and home ownership was talked about by people like Stephen 'Stumbo' Walsh, Sylvia Rueben, Mick Miller, Harry Daphne. A lot of those old people spoke passionately about allowing our people ownership and removing the shackles from our people's feets.

"There's going to be a lot of challenges at the community level. Places like Palm and Yarrabah have a lot of sad history. We have to allow, I think, our children to move forward with dignity.

"Economic development has to be the key."

More than 20 Palm Islanders travelled to Innisfail last week to celebrate a successful Native Title Determination with several hundred other Mamu family and friends. Application for the claim was made in 2001 with several hold-ups along the way – but they finally made it on Friday 1 November and a great day of celebrations was enjoyed by all!
