



## Six Barracudas picked for regional rep side

Six Palm Islanders — Mickeal Sibley, Clifford Beetham, Selwyn Bowman, Clinton Pearson, Fred Bulsey and Darryl Pearson — have been picked to play on a Northern United Representative side which will meet Queensland Outback on TI in mid-July.

It's a measure of how strongly the Palm Island Barracudas performed at the Remote Area Rugby League FNQ Rugby League Challenge in Cairns late last month.

In their first game the Barracudas defeated last year's winners Torres Strait Stingers 37-30.

Second up the Barracudas lost to Northern Cape 54-28 who went on to win the carnival and in their final game Barracudas lost 30-24 to Southern Cape.

Coach Roy Prior said overall it was a good weekend.

"It's important we take the positives out of the carnival,

we had five players who hadn't played for our representative side before so it was about development and moving forward," he said.

"With a massive win in our first game over last year's winner Torres Strait the boys were on a high."


On Palm Island the community group was the biggest yet with more than 147 people in attendance.
