A group of senior St Michael's students have initiated a fund-raiser with the goal of surprising some of our community elders and families who might otherwise be struggling this Christmas with gifts.





Boxers on their way to nationals

PALM Island PCYC boxers Joseph Nallajar, 17, Darryl Richardson, 16 and Leelan Sibley, 14, will travel to Sydney later this month for the Australian Boxing League national titles.

Joseph will fight in the 60kg division, Darryl in 71kg and Leelan in 51kg classes.

"Fighters from Queensland, NSW, Victoria and Tasmania will compete at the titles to be held at the Marrickville Town Hall," trainer Ray Dennis said.

"Leelan is an outstanding prospect who is unbeaten in five fights.

"He certainly has a good future if he trains well."

Joseph packs a power punch and has been training hard in the PCYC Gym in a bid to lose weight and be super fit for his campaign.

Darryl is an all-round quality boxer who possesses a knockout punch and great stamina.

The team will travel to Sydney by plane on 24th November after staying at the Townsville home of Art of Strength Club trainer Scooter Hooper the previous night.

Mr Dennis has trained 41 Australian Title winners, 60 Queensland champions and 92 Golden Gloves gold medalists.

He said another young boxer, Brayden Nallajar, was also bound to be a future Australian champion.

"I have a very high opinion of Brayden," he said.

He said they were still hoping to find sponsors for the trip.
