

### Funds secured for bridge upgrade

Palm Island Aboriginal Shire Council has secured \$216 000 in funding under Round Two of the Australian Government's Bridges Renewal Program to support a vital upgrade of the Sandy Boyd Creek bridge.

Federal Member for Herbert, Ewen Jones said the Program was designed to bolster the productivity of local bridges, and give councils the support they need to better serve communities and drive greater efficiency in road freight and traffic movement.

"It is clear Councils have thought seriously about how well their proposal addressed the objectives of the Program and, in many cases, have taken the time to consult with local industry on their needs and priorities," he said. "This upgrade means Palm Island will soon have access to safer and more reliable road access.

"The project was identified as a priority by Palm Island Aboriginal Council and the work will be managed by local government — showing this Government's commitment to providing real outcomes from the local level up."

Mayor Alf Lacey said a lot of hard work had gone into securing the funding.

"The groundwork for achieving this funding was laid some time ago and it's taken quite a lot of work to get to this point," he said. "I'd like to thank our Councillors and staff for their commitment to this project."

North West Queensland Chief Executive Officer Glenys Schuntner said they were also happy to have helped.

"Almost one in five (18%) of the successful applications across Queensland have come from North and West communities," Ms Schuntner said. "These projects are of a scale which can quickly be mobilised and will be a welcome boost to the local economies. RDA is pleased to have assisted in the process of promoting these funding opportunities to councils and provide support to councils that sought our advice to make stronger applications."










#### Sports membership voucher scheme now open

The Queensland Government's 'Get Started Vouchers' program are open for applications Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships Curtis Pitt says.

""Get Started Vouchers' provide up to \$150 to eligible families to help cover the membership and associated costs of joining a sports club, which can make a real difference to a child's development by encouraging them to be active and participate in their local club," Mr Pitt said.

"We know from previous figures that there's a keen interest in this program from both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island communities.

Children are eligible to apply for a voucher if they are a Queensland resident aged from 5-17 inclusive and the child, or their parent, carer or guardian, holds a Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card.

Mr Pitt said 'Get Started Vouchers' are issued on a 'first come, first served' basis and urged families to act quickly.

to represent the club and island.


"We will be going to as many tournaments as possible starting late February and into early March." Mr Dennis said.
