Water pipes to undergo 'critical' upgrade

A vital upgrade of our water infrastructure will start this week, with the replacelment of 420 m of pipeline along Farm Road between the water treatment plant and Solomon Dam, Palm Island Mayor Mislam Sam says.

Cr Sam said it was a Government project to be undertaken by FB Contracting.

"PIASC staff are liaising with Government and the contractors to help with the smooth running of this project," he said.

"We have insisted on as many backup plans and strategies as possible to ensure residents aren't negatively impacted during this critical work, especially if we face rain, delays or other events beyond our control.

"The existing pipeline is over 30 years old and has to be replaced to avoid leaks and deliver high auality drinking water to residents.

"Our water treatment people will be juggling a large workload over the next eight weeks to facilitate the completion of this project by November, which is a very tight timeframe."

He said residents were advised the Contractor would be digging trenches and operating heavy machinery alongside Farm Road.

"Please keep yourselves and your children a safe distance from these works." Cr Sam said.

He said the contractor would work seven days a week from 6am to 5pm.

Voluntary redundancies now open

Expressions of Interest for PIASC staff to take up Voluntary Redundancies open today for the next two weeks CEO Adele Young says.

"From now until Friday 25 September staff are eligible to apply if they wish to be considered," Ms Young said.

"Council has already started a repair plan to turn our organisation around and tackle the legacy issues we have been left with - in the face of a \$7 million deficit, with no cash or savings, we have no choice.

"I have already halved senior

management and taken steps to reduce expenditure to help address the shortfall."

She said the redundancy offer was a rare opportunity.

"Making an application doesn't mean you will automatically be accepted, but every application will be assessed against clear criteria," she said.

"All the information is available on our website, or by contacting our HR Manager or team leaders.

"Everything we do is about making Council a sustainable, high performing organisation where staff are supported and valued in delivering quality services to residents.

"We've made a start, but there is much more to do."

She said applications would be assessed by no later than Friday 2 October.
