Council adopted the new financial year's budget at its Ordinary Meeting late in June, Mayor Territa Dick says.

Key budget points are:

- New apprentices and trainees
- New public toilets and seating areas in public spaces
- Upgrades to parks, council fencing and signs.
- Funding for grassroots programs in women's services, Our Learning Our Way, cultural centre and an Indigenous Knowledge Centre as well as community and cultural events.

KASC have also undertaken restoration works for Carp Shire along Dunbar road heading towards Mareeba. Anyone who has driven the road to Cairns or Normanton lately will agree our KASC Roads Crew, made up of Wheels, Pigdog, Rueben and Smokey, have done an amazing job and have our main access road in fantastic shape.
