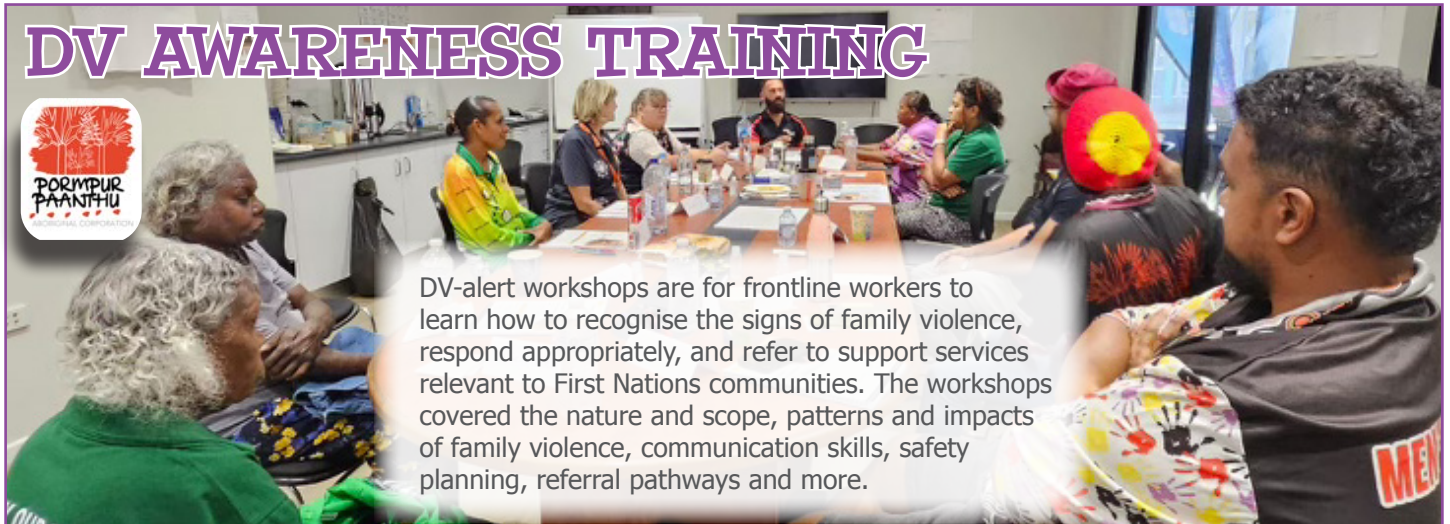


DV AWARENESS TRAINING



DV-alert workshops are for frontline workers to learn how to recognise the signs of family violence, respond appropriately, and refer to support services relevant to First Nations communities. The workshops covered the nature and scope, patterns and impacts of family violence, communication skills, safety planning, referral pathways and more.
