# New name for PPAC propos

As Pormpur Paanthu Aboriginal Corporation continues to grow and expand, our services now reach all members of the community — including children, youth, women, men, and people with disabilities, CEO Ganthi Kuppusamy says.

"To ensure our identity truly reflects the broad and inclusive work we do, the Board has proposed changing the corporation's name," she said.

"This change would better represent the diversity of programs and supports we deliver, while also making clear that our focus is on the well-being of the entire community, not just one group.

"It is an opportunity to align our name with our vision: creating a safe, supportive, and inclusive environment for everyone in Pormpuraaw."

#### That Special Resolution is as follows:

1. Name: The name of the corporation be changed from: Pormpur Paanthu Aboriginal Corporation to Pormpur Ngamplin Pam Mongthak Aboriginal Corporation.

#### Proposed Special Resolution to amend the Rule Book

Motion: That by special resolution, the members of Pormpur Paanthu Aboriginal Corporation agree to amend clause 1 of the rule book (constitution) of Pormpur Paanthu Aboriginal Corporation.

Please note that the Rule Book does not contain a provision for a member to appoint a proxy.

(State Penalties Enforcement Registry)

### PPAC can help.

As a partner, PPAC can apply for Work and Development Orders (WDO) on behalf of clients for the following activities:

- Counselling (including drug and alcohol counselling and excluding financial counselling).
- Culturally appropriate programs.

# If people can't afford to pay in full or need more time to pay:

- Anyone with SPER debt can go online and set up a payment plan, via bank account, card or an eligible Centrelink benefit at sper.qld.gov.au. They can also check their balance, view debts and update their details with SPER to make sure they don't miss important notifications.
- People who have an existing payment plan can contact SPER on 1300 729 643 to discuss their circumstances or for help, Monday to Friday, 8 am to 5pm (excluding public holidays).

Eligible clients can apply for a WDO to manage their approved activities. See the Healing Centre for more details—the service is mutually beneficial to community residents and PPAC.
