Welcome to Pormpur Ngamplin Pam Mongthak – name change officially approved by ORIC

Pormpur Paanthu Aboriginal Corporation's application to change their name under subsection 88-1(1) of the *Corporations (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander) Act 2006 (CATSI Act)* has been approved by the Office of the Registrar of Indigenous Corporations (ORIC).

The name change took effect from last Monday, 10 November 2025.

The historic decision was made by special vote at a special general meeting last month.

The new name - **Pormpur Ngamplin Pam Mongthak Aboriginal Corporation** - means Pormpuraaw Family Services.

CEO Ganthi Kuppusamy said

the decision to change the name was about better reflecting the 'whole of community' services the organisation offered - from women, men, child care services to NDIS..

"Now the new name is officially in place we are obliged to use the new name in all communications and on all our documents," she said.

"The shortened form of the name will be PNPM."
