# Yarrabah is now well into Stage 2 of easing current Coronavirus restrictions Mayor Ross Andrews says.

"It means we are allowed to travel within our own Designated Travel Zone without needing to go into quarantine to return," he said.

"They only have to go into quarantine if they go outside of that area, south of Cardwell, for example.

"The most important message we can give to people leaving Yarrabah is to make sure they keep up their social distancing and hand washing.

"Whatever comes back into our community now is our own responsibility – yours, if you are travelling to and from Cairns to shop or do whatever else you need to do.

"Do everything you can, at every opportunity to make sure you're not the one to bring Covid-19 back in with you. "It will be devastating to us if you do."

He said the other thing to remember was another outbreak in Cairns would likely see the lockdown returned.

"We should all be cautious and aware that if another outbreak occurs in Cairns, they will move us straight back into restrictions," he said.

"I think people are generally aware things are far from normal over the hill, even though it might sound at times like things have gone back to normal.

"There are quite a few shops still closed and there are crosses on the ground to remind people to keep their distance, things like that.

"Nearly four months into this, things are still changing on a week to week basis, so we need the community to please keep up as best you can on Facebook and through other media.



"We still have some way to go with this, it's far from over."

Yarrabah Council has been awarded a grant to do a feasibility study into alternate energy for the community which will also create jobs, Mayor

Ross Andrews says.

"We're really excited about this government investment to enable us to explore this project, it's very innovative," he said.


"We're looking forward to working on it, our hopes are we will be able to be independent in terms of energy.

"Not only will it be efficient, but also green and cheaper, a real incentive to protect our environment and the community."

Planz Town Planning Project Manager Susie Lord said the project would look at the use of microgrids.

"Micro-grids use a mix of different energy sources such as solar, wind, biomass (burning plants and weeds) and waste (rubbish) to energy," she said.

"The project will look at creating a network of micro-grids using the latest renewable energy technologies to replace or upgrade the existing

electricity supply in Yarrabah.

"Reliable and reasonably priced electricity allows for new jobs opportunities and there will be opportunities for locals to talk about their ideas for energy and jobs. "The project also includes mentoring and education about energy and waste from primary school to the broader community."

She said the project was due to start in mid-July.
