

Early Learning Centre reopens tomorrow!

After nine months of closure, St Mary MacKillop Gooddo Early Learning Centre is set to reopen its doors to children and families tomorrow.

Executive Director Jo Goodrick said the service was forced to close in December last year after a significant environmental incident in which contaminated water inundated the building.

"The unexpected closure brought challenges for families and staff, but also an opportunity to reimagine the learning environment for the future." she said.

"Working in close partnership with the Palm Island Council, MMCNQ coordinated extensive building repairs and refurbishments, which were finished last month.

"Since then, our staff have been working with care and determination to restore the centre, ensuring every detail is ready for a safe, warm, and engaging return."

She said beyond the essential repairs, the closure had also created space for renewal.

"The centre has been fitted with brand-new learning resources and equipment, designed to support exploration, creativity, and a love of learning," she said.
